Announcements

Loree Holmes announced that the long-term program director retired and Lisa Roth, who has systems of care and trauma informed care experience, has been hired.

Jason Jones announced that Hillcrest closed and MacLaren has opened the new areas. Locally, OYA has hired a new transition PO, Rod Greene, whose duties will include mentoring, vocational follow through, and who will work with any school district.

Heather Murphy announced that the administrative home for CASA programs at the state level had transitioned from the Oregon Volunteers Commission to the Department of Administrative Services.

John Radich announced that Marilyn Jones has been appointed as the new child welfare director. Efforts to rebuild options since BRS funding was lost include looking into non-traditional placements (like hotels) for youth who can't be placed. There is baseline support to relieve the crisis. A bill passed which requires that every CPS investigation conclude with a disposition.

Matthew Sterner announced that the fall semester has begun and Phoenix students will be at MLK for the first time. While the pending strike will affect vocational programming and community services crews, classes will not be affected.

Janay Stroup announced that there is now a vocational counselor at Kalapuya High School. At Willamette High School they have implemented the "Freshman Focus" which provides extra support for students and their families which includes goal setting and weekly progress check-ins. They are hoping to expand with classes like AVID.

Nathaline Frener announced that with the possible strike some services will be suspended, however, coverage for food services and court is in place. YS has hired a bilingual Juvenile Counselor as well as a bilingual Mental Health Specialist. There has been a process change in Intake in that youth must be released immediately or moved to Detention. There have also been some supervisorial structural changes: Rob Selven is the Detention Supervisor; Suzanne Hughes is the Program Services Supervisor and will oversee DMC, equity issues, PREA, and mental health; and Mary Swindling is the sole Supervision Supervisor and is working on the PSM which is linked to DMC.
