LCOG's annual Appreciation Dinner to celebrate civic and regional accomplishments will be held on Thursday, January 28, 2010 at LCC's Center for Meeting and Learning in Eugene. A traditional component of this event is the formal recognition of an **elected official**, a **private citizen**, a **public employee**, and an **intergovernmental team** as being notably outstanding in their service, leadership and commitment to the regional community. **You are invited to submit nominations of candidates in any or all of the four award categories.**

Acceptable nominations of candidates for any of the awards must include a statement of no more than two typed pages in length describing the nominee's **contributions** to the community, the nominee's **achievements**, and the **rationale** for the selection of that nominee as the award recipient.

A screening committee will consider the nominations submitted and identify the award recipients for the year. The formal presentations will be made at the Appreciation Dinner.

Please consider the active citizens, high-performance public employees, effective intergovernmental teams and the dedicated elected officials with whom you are familiar and submit nominations for one or all of the awards **by Tuesday, December 1**. Nominations can be sent by:

- Demonstrated commitment to effective local government, regional cooperation and the welfare of the citizenry.
