 Re: Student Transit Pass – Group Pass Program

Background:

As you are aware, the Oregon Legislature terminated funding for the popular Lane Transit District Student (LTD) Transit Pass Program, thus ending transit service for 24,000 local middle and high school students at no cost to families or schools. To ease the transition, LTD worked with school staff to sell transit passes at local high schools and modified a group pass program to accommodate grade 6-12 students.

Status:

This new Group Pass/Commuter Club Voucher Program allows local schools to purchase group bus passes at a discounted rate by the month, quarter, or annually. As of October 21, 2011,^t 20 schools or school programs serving over 4,700 students have joined the Group Pass Program.
