

Watch for Pedestrians

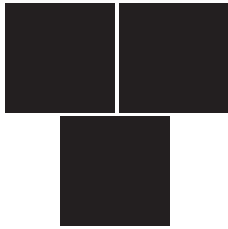
Please Help Keep Springfield's Streets Safe for Everyone!

Follow the law:

- ✓ Stop and remain stopped for pedestrians until they have cleared the lane in which the driver is traveling and the adjacent lane.
- ✓ Stop and remain stopped for a blind or blind and deaf pedestrian using a cane or a guide dog, until the pedestrian is completely across the roadway.

*The City of Springfield has installed new pedestrian warning lights.
Motorists should use the following instructions.*

Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon



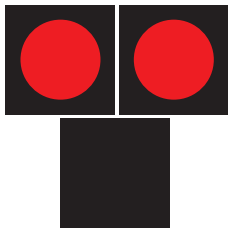
All lights are off, motorists may proceed



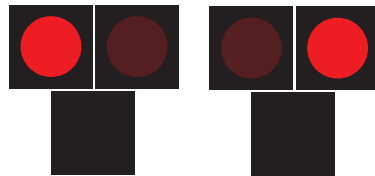
Yellow light flashing on & off, warning that the signal is about to change



Steady yellow light, motorists must stop if they can safely do so



Red lights on, all motorists must **STOP** & remain stopped



Red lights flashing in alternating manner, motorists must stop at the stop line, if pedestrians have crossed that half of the street motorists may proceed. The next motorist in line must repeat the same instructions.



All lights are off, motorists may proceed

Rapid Flashing Yellow Beacon

This warning light flashes so that motorists are aware there is a pedestrian who wants to cross the street. Drivers are legally obligated to stop for that person.

1. All lights off = vehicles proceed.
2. Yellow light flashing on and off (very quickly, like an emergency vehicle) = warning, a pedestrian would like to cross the street.

Stop in a safe manner and stay stopped until the person has crossed your lane and the travel lane next to you. You may proceed once the pedestrian has crossed the street, even if the light is still flashing
