### **Discussion**

While the 2019 session of the Oregon legislature did not include any transportation-related legislation approaching the scale of HB2017 from the 2017 session, there was a fair amount of legislation considered.

Attachment 1 to this memo presents the Oregon Department of Transportation's *Legislative Summary 2019*. This provides a comprehensive overview of the legislation considered (whether passed or not passed) that directly or indirectly affects ODOT. For more in-depth information on passed legislation, copies of 2019 enrolled bills (the copy of passed legislation that the Governor signs) may be found on the legislative website: <https://olis.leg.state.or.us/liz/2019R1/Measures/list/>.
