The **SBA 504** is fixed asset financing for larger projects. Example: \$10.0 million to construct new hotel. Breakdown: SBA 504 \$3.0 - \$3.5 million, Bank \$5.0 million, Borrower \$1.5 - \$2.0 million (cash & land value).

The **<u>Revolving Loan Fund (RLF)</u>** is one of LCOG's local loan programs for smaller deals (\$700,000 and less). It is used primarily within the Eugene/Springfield UGB. It focuses on real property and equipment – but can finance working capital with adequate collateral (no lines of credit). 15 years, fully amortized.

The **Rural Business Development Fund (RBDF)** is LCOG's other local loan program. It is available anywhere in Lane County that is **outside** the UGB of Eugene/Springfield. It has the same rate and terms as the RLF. It can finance not only everything the RLF does, but it can also finance property that is for **investment** (no owner occupancy required).

None of the loan programs can finance residential real estate. However, if a commercial business will occupy 51% or more of an *existing* building, the remaining 49% can be residential.
