A Few Things Going on at LCOG

LCOG is leading an Oregon Department of Transportation funded study of public transportation needs and options between Florence and Eugene. This project began after hearing from community members within this corridor that affordable public transportation was needed but unavailable for job commute, personal needs, recreation and medical trips. There is a survey here to gather feedback about how, when, why and if public transportation would be used between Florence and Eugene. The results will be used to guide the project direction and will be included in the final project report.

LCOG entered into an IGA with **Veneta** for **IS Managed Services**. LCOG offers an annual subscription for Information Services to provide services that fit the needs of our members while providing set costs. LCOG is partnering with **LRAPA** on a web application for displaying collected data to the public.

LCOG will offer a new **Health Insurance** choice to its employees beginning January 1, 2019: An employee Health Insurance Advisory Committee looked at options and recommended that for 2019 LCOG should renew with our current plan (CIS), but with a choice of two plans for medical: The existing Regence plan; or a new Kaiser plan. The Regence plan is the current High Deductible Health Plan (HDHP) with an employer contribution into a Health Reimbursement Account (HRA) at \$150 or \$200 per month, for a yearly total of \$1,800 or \$2,400, depending on plan option chosen. The Kaiser plan, which is a new option, is a co-pay plan that has no employer contribution into an HRA.
