#### LTD WARNS ABOUT FRAUDULENT WEBSITE



Lane Transit District is alerting the public about a fraudulent website posing as LTD's website.

On July 14, LTD was made aware of a fraudulent website using the name Lane Transit and claiming to be headquartered at its offices in the Glenwood.

A prompt investigation determined the website is a front for an online fraudulent pay-for-shipping scheme. LTD promptly reported the site to the FBI, the Federal Trade Commission, and Google. Through LTD's legal counsel, it sent takedown demands to the website host provider.

In the meantime, LTD says anyone who has been defrauded and lost money to the scammers can file a complaint using the FBI Cybercrime Unit webpage, located here: <a href="Internet Crime Complaint Center(IC3)">Internet Crime Complaint Center(IC3)</a> | Home Page.

# NEW LANE COUNTY EMERGENCY ALERT SYSTEM

Public safety partners in Lane County are updating their emergency alerting service to the statewide alerting system OR-Alert, which will be called Lane

Alerts locally, to send emergency alerts – including evacuation notifications – to residents and visitors.

Residents should go to <a href="www.LaneAlerts.org">www.LaneAlerts.org</a> to create a free Lane Alerts account and select where and how they would like to receive emergency alerts. Residents can also text their ZIP code to 888777.

Lane Alerts allows people to opt-in to receive notifications via phone call, text message and email based on locations they care about. At minimum, people signing up must provide their name and one method of contact. Residents can choose to receive notifications about emergency events that may affect their home, workplace, child's school, etc. The types of emergencies that people may receive alerts about include evacuations, severe weather, flooding, police activity, and more.

Lane Alerts partner agencies include Lane County Emergency Management, Lane County Sheriff's Office, and Central Lane Communications Center. The system is powered by the State of Oregon's OR-Alert program and Everbridge. Learn more about OR-Alert at <a href="https://www.oralert.gov">www.oralert.gov</a>.

### **EUGENE POLICE COLLECTING BABY DIAPERS**

Join the Eugene Police Department in collecting diapers for Lane County Diaper Bank. The bank helps families who are struggling with diaper needs in our community. The goal is 3,000 diapers for 120 babies. Bring diaper donations down between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., August 1 through 31, to the collection at 300 Country Club Road (EPD) or 230 4th Street (SPD).
