WHAT IS A COG?

A Council of Governments is a voluntary association of cities, counties and special purpose districts within a region. COGs serve as regional planning, coordination, program development and service delivery organizations in local communities across the nation. Local issues often cross jurisdictional boundaries and can be most effectively addressed by communities working together within a regional forum.

Councils of Governments solve area-wide problems. COGs are designed to help the public sector operate more efficiently and effectively through the pooling of resources so that communities accomplish more than they could individually.

In Lane County, Oregon, the advantages of cooperation and joint ventures between local governments were recognized in the mid-1940s. LCOG has no taxing or ordinance authority; rather, it conducts its work at the direction and with the voluntary participation of its member agencies. Thirty-five governments and agencies are members of LCOG.

COMMUNITY RECOGNITION AWARD



In December 2023, the Board of Directors of the Senior Provider Information Network (SPIN) of Lane County selected LCOG's Senior Meals Program as one of their Community Awards recipients in recognition of service to the aging population in Lane County. This award was accompanied with a \$500 donation to the Senior Meals Program.

SPIN's mission is to provide education, information, and networking opportunities to professionals of Lane County, so they can better serve seniors and persons with disabilities. SPIN expanded to Lane County in 2004. Currently, there are about 350 members in Lane County that receive our monthly meeting announcements and about 70 people attend our events each month. In 2009, SPIN of Lane County started the Annual SPIN Fair. This gives group members an opportunity to provide community education, promote their business, network, and inform seniors about resources in the area. More than 350 people attend the fair annually and attendance has grown year after year.
