While "Census Day - April 1" has passed, the Census count is still continuing.

As of today – The National Self-Response Rate: 61.8% / Oregon: 64.2% / Lane County: 66.7%

While Lane County is above the state and national response rates, we still have work to do! Her is a

The Census Bureau will send out Census workers to every residence that has not yet responded but that has been delayed.

We are doing great as a county – but we still have work to do! Make announcements at meetings and on social media! **Census results affect planning and funding for:**

- Infrastructure—including programs for highway planning and construction, Section 8 housing, federal transit, community development, and rural water and waste disposal systems.
- Employment and training—including programs for vocational rehabilitation state grants, dislocated workers, and American Indian and Alaska Native employment and training.
- Healthcare—including programs such as Medicaid, Medicare Part B, State Children's Health Insurance, and the prevention and treatment of substance abuse.
- Education—including programs such as Head Start, Pell Grants, school lunches, rural education, adult education, and grants for preschool special education.

The list goes on, including programs to support rural areas, to restore wildlife, to prevent child abuse, to prepare for wildfires, and to provide housing assistance for older adults, and many other programs. Census data was also used to determine the amount of funding that went to states to respond to the COVID-19 Crises. Your response is vital!

LCOG RECEIVES \$1 MILLION CARES ACT EDA LOAN GRANT

LCOG will receive \$1 million in funding from the U.S. Economic Development Agency (EDA) to replenish our Revolving Loan Fund (RLF). The EDA reached out to us because of the success of our current EDA RLF. This program will work just like our existing RLF loan programs with a focus on COVID impacted firms and the \$1 million needs to be loaned out by 12/31/2021.

Basics of Revolving Loan Fund

AMOUNT: Up to \$150,000 (typically 40% of total project)*

- Bank does 50% of total project
- Subordinate to bank financing

RATE: Prime (5.5% floor), fixed at time of closing

AMORTIZATION AND TERM: 10 to 15 year amortization and maturity; Interest rate is fixed for 15 years (Estimate - 5.50%)

COLLATERAL: should have adequate collateral (80% - 90% loan to value)

USE OF PROCEEDS:

- Real Estate, equipment, working capital (refinance in some cases).
- Mixed-use with residential allowed

FEES:

- \$500.00 deposit (which will be applied toward your closing fees).
- 1.5% closing fee can be financed.
- Out of pocket expenses

Low prepayment penalty for first three years (1% of the prepayment amount).

LOCATION: Anywhere in Lane County focusing on Eugene/Springfield.

*We can do just about any combination with the bank, but generally don't loan more than the bank does. We can work with seller financing – but the seller would need to go into second lien position.
