NEW LGPS PROGRAM MANAGER

LCOG recently hired a Program Manager for Local Government Personnel Services (LGPS). LGPS is LCOG's human resources consulting program that provides services to member and non-member local government agencies. This position also will include some internal HR responsibilities, including classification/compensation work, recruiting, investigations, and trainings.

Stacy Marple will begin in this position toward the end of August. She comes to LCOG with a background in human resources and program management at Emergence and the University of Oregon. She also has experience in improving processes and procedures.

The Local Government Personnel Institute (LGPI) was founded in 1971 as a joint venture between the <u>League of Oregon Cities</u> (LOC) and the <u>Association of Oregon Counties</u> (AOC). In 2019, LGPI has ceased operation under its former home, LOC, and its portfolio of services moved under the Lane Council of Government's (LCOG) umbrella with a new name, Local Government Personnel Services (LGPS). Our program provides wellness checks to our local seniors and adults with disabilities, in addition to delivering hot and frozen meals to them. This summer's hot weather makes what our Meals on Wheels team does even more important. By checking in with our most vulnerable residents, our volunteers ensure they are well and get the resources they need.

We encourage the public to volunteer or donate to the Senior Meals Program. Currently, we have half as many volunteers right now than we did right before the pandemic started. That means in order to get our volunteer numbers back up to pre-pandemic levels and reopen our Café 60 congregate dining locations, we need 200 new volunteers.
