### SAFE LANE TRANSPORTATION COALITION NEWS

Earlier this year, Irene Ferguson, 70, was struck and killed on a northwest Eugene street. This narrow road has no sidewalks or crosswalks, but is a much-used shortcut for Beltline motorists who want to connect to River Road to avoid rush-hour tie-ups at the River Road interchange.

The Safe Lane Transportation Coalition - a partnership between the Central Lane MPO (LCOG) and Lane County, with support from ODOT, implements a vision laid out in the statewide Transportation Safety Action Plan and focuses on reducing fatal and severe crashes in our region through education, outreach, and enforcement efforts.



Two businesses, Delta Sand and Gravel and Knife River, are working with the Safe Lane Transportation Coalition to provide "slow down" yard signs and donated reflective vests for assisted-living residents along the corridor mentioned above. The Safe Lane Coalition, Lane County, and Lane Transit District's Point2Point program also are providing pedestrian safety education at assisted-living residential centers in the area.

## THE 2020 CENSUS - COMPLETE COUNT COMMITTEE VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The Census Bureau wants local jurisdictions to involve community groups that can help bring in response from everyone but especially from hard-to-reach segments of the community: elderly shut-ins, Hispanic and non-white communities, homeless and transitional-shelter population, remote rural population, university students. etc.
