NEXT PHASE OF THE 2020 CENSUS

While "Census Day - April 1" has passed, the Census count is still continuing.



On Monday, May 11, 2020, US Census workers will be in our communities in a few areas that do not receive mail at their home residence and/or only receive mail at a PO Box, or where the mail delivery information for the housing unit cannot be verified. These are called

Update Leave (UL) areas. Note these are not the same as areas where the residence has not

responded.

WHAT TO EXPECT:

In keeping with COVID-19 social distancing best practices, Census employees will be provided with Personal Protective Equipment, including face masks, gloves and hand sanitizer for use while dropping off packets in Update Leave areas.


Employees will also be wearing their Census ID Badge, have their Census logo laptop bag, and a Census laptop. Employees may be seen using the laptop; they are linking the specific geospatial location of the housing unit to the Census ID (the 12-digit code) on the Census form or information being left.

Employees have been instructed to **<u>NOT</u>** knock or ring the doorbell, but instead will simply leave the packet on the doorstep of the residence.

Each packet contains, in a plastic bag:

- A paper Census questionnaire with Census ID.
- Census phone number to take the Census with a live person over the phone.
- Web address to respond to the Census online.

TRAVEL OREGON COVID-19 EMERGENCY

RESPONSE GRANT

This gratn Program could benefit some of the busniesses in your communities. The fund is \$800,000 and specifically targets rural/small businesses and those who have NOT received funds from EIDL or PPP.

Deadline: It has a short opening window to apply – May 11-15.

Eligible applicants include those listed below that are currently *doing business* in Oregon, have been conducting business for the past five years and can demonstrate direct work in support of improving the economic impacts of Oregon's travel and tourism industry:

- Oregon lodging properties with 25 or fewer full-time employees on January 31, 2020.
- Oregon-based tour operators, guides and outfitters with a budget greater than \$100,000 in 2019 and carrying worker's compensation insurance; and can demonstrate working partnership referrals or bookings of lodging packages at properties such as hotels, motels, BnB's and resorts.
- Oregon Destination Marketing/Management Organizations.
- Federally recognized tribes, including tribally owned enterprises and tribal member owned businesses that directly support the travel and tourism industry.

LCOG'S SENIOR MEALS PROGRAM NEWS



The Senior Meals Program helps people age 60 and older maintain their independence by providing food, friendship and safety check. Senior Meals Programs operate 11 Café 60 dining rooms throughout Lane County and Meals on Wheels volunteers deliver lunches and safety checks for home-bound older neighbors in 8 Lane County communities. Both programs serve adults age 60 and older and their spouses, regardless of their income.

Last year, the Meals on Wheels program, in partnership with Food for Lane County, served over 188,800 meals to 1,460 participants. The Café 60's served over 66,200 meals to 940 participants. The Senior Meals Program is currently serving approximately 10,000 meals monthly across Lane County.

Operations during COVID-19 Pandemic

All **Meals on Wheels routes** are continuing to operate with volunteers. Our volunteers are not having direct contact with meal recipients to minimize health risks for all parties. These health risks are being alleviated by a "knock and drop" approach that allows us to continue to check on our consumers while maintaining appropriate "social distancing" measures. Our **Café 60 dining locations** are providing meals to go only and maintaining a regular lunch operation schedule in most locations.

Euphoria Chocolate and Texas Roadhouse give to S&DS Senior Meal Programs during COVID-19 Pandemic

Senior and Disability Services, a division of Lane Council of Governments, will partner its Senior Meals Program with two local partners: **Euphoria Chocolate** and the **Texas Roadhouse** to provide a special meal to program participants on Friday, May 15, 2020. These efforts will provide 250 meals to participants in Springfield.

Meals will be available for pick-up between 11:30 am and 12:30 pm on Friday, May 15 at the Willamalane Adult Activity Center, 215 W. C St., Springfield.

The Senior Meals Program staff and volunteers will provide packaging to portion meals and serve them throughout Springfield while continuing to adhere to social distancing guidelines. This collaboration is a response to the increased demand for food services and resources due to COVID-19.

New Springfield Meals on Wheels Route

Beginning this week, LCOG Senior & Disability Services started to serve new participants that have been on the Meals on Wheels wait list in Springfield!
