# **COBURG MAYOR RAY SMITH PASSES AWAY**

LCOG would like to honor Coburg Mayor Ray Smith for his commitment to public service. Mayor Smith passed away Thursday, October 27, 2022, after a courageous battle with cancer.

Ray Smith's career in local government spanned decades. He was elected to the Coburg City Council and began serving in 2013. He was appointed Mayor in March 2016 and elected for a two-year term in 2018 and 2020. He previously served as Chair of the Coburg Planning Commission in the early 1990s.

He also volunteered for more than 15 years with the Coburg Rural Fire District, retiring as their Assistant Chief in 2003. Ray worked for the Eugene Springfield Fire Department for more than 25 years, retiring in 2018 as a Fire Captain/Paramedic.

Ray was also a long-time member of the Metropolitan Policy Committee, working with the Central Lane Metropolitan Policy Organization (MPO), local government, state and federal agencies, and the public to improve transportation in the Central Lane County region. LCOG is grateful for Ray's many contributions to the Lane County community.

He always attended the Mayor's Roundtable, a group facilitated by LCOG, to share the latest news about Coburg with the mayors of Lane County. He served as a member of the LCOG Board of Directors since 2018.

"Mayor Smith was a dedicated public servant who cared deeply for our region and was passionate about making a difference in his community. Even with his failing health, he was still committed to carry out his mayoral duties and honor the trust the public put in him. He is gone far too soon." Ray was an outstanding leader in the community. The City of Coburg thrived under his leadership. He will be greatly missed.

Memorial donations may be made to <u>Coburg Main Street</u> for the purpose of upgrading the IOOF Hall. This project was extremely important to the Mayor, and he was actively planning for it at the time of his death. The project will provide ADA access to the building and restrooms and upgrade the kitchens. The Mayor wanted this building to be available and useful for community events. Memorial donations may also be made to the <u>Pete Moore Hospice House</u> in Eugene, Oregon.

# **RLID 4.0**

One of the many programs at LCOG is the Regional Land Information Database, also known as RLID.

The <u>RLID website</u> has been in place for 20 years and is used 2.6 million times per year by more than 4,000 users, both government and private sector, for a wide range of purposes including economic development, real estate transactions, and various analyses. RLID provides an easy-to-use interface for searching for properties and generating reports containing authoritative government-sourced data.

A project is underway to replace the RLID website with a brand new version (RLID V4) that will dramatically increase usability, will work on mobile devices as well as desktop computers, and will offer vastly improved reports that leverage a newly published RLID Data Warehouse. The new RLID website will better enable users to understand what is happening on a property, particularly the more complex properties that have multiple tax accounts, multiple addresses, multiple structures, and various other complexities. The RLID Team is currently completing the vendor-selection process and expects to begin the V4 development project in early 2023.

# CIS MEMBERS HAVE ACCESS TO CYBERSECURITY INSURANCE

Nearly two in three midsize organizations throughout the United States have suffered a ransomware attack in the past 18 months. Even more concerning is that 20% of them spent at least \$250,000 to recover from it. Oregon public entities have also been victims and continue to suffer through cyberattacks. Because the cyber insurance market has struggled, CIS (Citycounty Insurance Services) has made changes to its cyber program. Beginning July 1, 2022, cyber liability coverage will be under the property-line umbrella, rather than liability — and will give members three-tiered choices for coverage.

Options Description

Tier One \$50,000 in coverage; no application required

Tier Two \$200,000 additional coverage; application required,

assessment recommended

Tier Three Excess Cyber over \$250,000; application required


#### **UNITY LENDING**

Their Senior Emergency Support Fund (Fund) contributes to the health, well-being and independence of low-income seniors in both rural and urban areas throughout Lane County, working with Senior & Disabled Services to fill-in gaps where other funds are not available.

The LSSC is now registered with AmazonSmile to receive donations from purchases.
